I. Approve minutes - September 2023

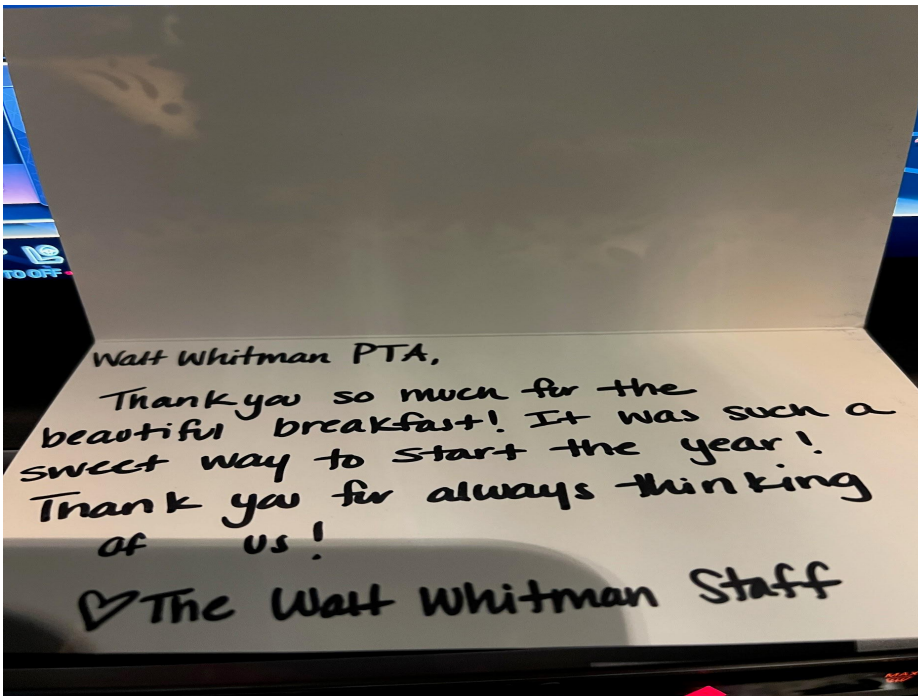
Minutes from our last PTA meeting were sent out in email for review and some copies were on the tables. No one had any questions or comments. The minutes were approved.

IV. Principal's Report – Mr. Snyder

- Welcome to new social worker - Mr. Imbroglio
- Walt Whitman has a total of 398 students (almost at its MAX), there was a bumpy start to the school year with a power outage and lockdowns.



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- NWEAs are complete - there will be a district notification when the results are available.
- NWEA and COGATS will be used to place students in Project Beyond. This is the first time both tests are being used.
- Grades 3-5 kids will be allowed to go to other classrooms during recess so they can interact with others. There will be activity rooms. Kids can fill out a google form the morning of a day with inclement weather. The school is partnering with PTA for fun activities. If the "real feel" temperature (windchill) is above 32 degrees, kids go outside.
- There is a lot of stuff in the lost and found in the lobby. Please take a look. You can do so at PTA meetings.
- Parking - be kind and courteous to each other. No double parking. There will no longer be a security guard in the parking lot in the afternoon. An average of about 100 students are picked up each day. *Parents requested another security guard for this though Mr. Snyder.*
- There is a "plan of action" form to inform the building of what you need for an event - as of now PTA presidents are completing the form.
- Halloween - only kindergarten will do a parade this year because of lack of parking for all the parents. No halloween masks (except K), no face paint, no props, no candy, no GROUP costumes.
- Please monitor your children for leaving other students out on text chains and pictures as it spills into school.
- Mr. Snyder's text messaging will be moving from Remind texts to Canvas Blackboard texts. There is no sign up - only what you have entered into the system for Family ID. Questions, call the main office.
- No update on Facilities.

Later in our meeting, we will take a vote to adopt NYS PTA Resolutions. We will also vote on modifying our budget for our PARP committee and vote on the annual audit adoption.

In our Nov PTA meeting, we will vote on the PTA nominating committee for the 2024-25 school year. Please let us know if you are interested in participating in the selection for the next executive committee and delegates. For more information about the nominating committee positions and its needs, please reach out to us.

Please try to attend as many PTA meetings as possible. Your attendance is important and needed. There are many ways to keep yourself apprised of all things PTA. 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We are trying to get parents back in the building as often as possible but please remember you must follow the rules set forth by the school. When we are here, we must stick to the program and ensure that we stay in areas we are approved for. I.e. The book fair means we stay in the library and not wander around the building. Same goes for the school store.

We would also like to introduce some more grade level programming too. Grade level programming might look like a grade level family fun night, or another type of evening activity that is directed at a specific grade or grades. VI. Standing Committee Reports

- A. We heard the report of the **Arts in Education / Curriculum Enrichment** committee given by Jacqueline Braunstein

The kids and teachers all had an amazing time at the ultimate Human Board Game assembly. It was a great way to kick off the year. Up next, during PARP, we will have the Earth Dome to tie into our parp theme. The kids will attend in small groups and learn all about the earth with a giant inflatable dome that they will be able to go inside.

- B. We heard the report of the **Bookfair Committee** given by Jacqueline Braunstein, Cindy Ho, Rachel Levenson or Samantha Lehenhart.

The purpose of this committee is to raise funds for the PTA through the sale of books. A portion of the proceeds goes directly to our PTA. It is also a great opportunity for parents to volunteer in the school! The fall book fair will be held on Thursday, October 12th. Any students that were absent or forgot their money are able to shop the morning of Friday, October 13th. We highly recommend that you set up an eWallet online for a better shopping experience. During the book fair, parents are needed to help the students choose age and subject appropriate books, as well as to make sure that the students have enough money to purchase the items they want. An online volunteer sign-up sheet was emailed last week, many thanks to those of you who are already signed up. If you would like to join the committee and help set up on Wednesday or help on Friday, please reach out. A Scholastic flyer was also backpacked last week as a guide to potential books. The Pre-Order Sale of Diary of a Wimpy Kid No Brainer is also available through October 19th.

- C. We heard the report of the **Board of Education Reporter** given by Carly Laffie/Tara Ginsburg.

Superintendent Report: A presentation was given on how our education has improved - MTSS program (Multi Tiered System of Support). Mission statement: The mission of the Syosset Central School District is to prepare students to thrive in both the future we imagine and one which may evolve in ways yet to be envisioned. Targeted support for struggling learners through a tiered system of support. Tier 1: universal support for any identified student and takes place in the classroom itself, Tiered 2: if more support is needed they move up the tiers into small group instruction which is provided outside of the classroom for 10-15% of students: Academic support such as OT, Speech, counseling and social skills group; Takes place during their flex block. Tier 3: takes place outside of the classroom to focus on students who continue to show evidence of struggle; MTSS continues to monitor students and they may go up or down the tiers; This goes into much more detail and if you are interested in learning more please refer back to the Syosset website for the presentation.



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Coach buses: In wake of the Farmingdale bus accident, Dr Rogers explained in detail how the district plans ahead and gets to reserve buses through a process and an algorithm. Buses are inspected prior to the drive, Driver signs off on that inspection, Checklist on district level (check the map, route, insurance, registration, and drivers), Drivers give students emergency procedures, This all happens before the bus leaves

School Facilities: Woodbury School; Creative ideas on how we can make the space useful for the district and community. If used for office space we do not get state aid. So can do instruction in the form of a small pre k program. There is a half gym in the Woodbury School which can be used for OT, PT and PE services or hosting district wide meetings. At night can do continuing education for adults and community groups. Office space currently used in the South Woods building could then shift over to the Woodbury School freeing up classroom space needed for the growth at South Woods Middle School. **HBT:** They showed a conceptual site plan for HBT potentially adding a track and football field. **Berry Hill:** Dr Rogers presented how they can replace the BH portable: Dr Rogers presented the facilities priorities layers. Health and Safety being first: The HBT vestibule, SHS rear bus loop, Guidance Suite/ Robotics at SHS. Portable replacements. Manage Enrollment Growth: SHS Library and 5 classrooms, Southwoods and classroom configurations, Woodbury School rehabilitation. Athletic Growth and Comparability: HBT track and Additional gyms at SHS.

Dr Rogers was excited to mention that The Inflation Reduction Act may contain grant funds to deal with climate-related concerns such as additional air conditioning in schools. We are exploring the viability for large spaces like gymnasiums as it's consistent with our goals.

Board Members Response: Timing for the portables for BH; 2 options were given by H2M - One, make them prefabricated which means they are built off site and delivered and built onto the school which is less disruptive to the students and saves time, but there isn't as much longevity as being built on site; Two. being built on site which will take double the time, but is more disruptive to the students but is better quality and will last longer. Both are estimated at the same price. BOE member requests to get all this information together to get a vote in by EOY (2023) so we can start the process and not wait until May to vote, The BOE discusses how to bucket the projects and what projects should be taken on together – a lot of decisions need to be made, A lot of discussion between the board, Dr Rogers and H2M on how to prioritize, plan and execute. A board member asks Dr Rogers about how to make schools more welcoming to have the parents in the buildings more (like pre-pandemic). He responds that we are back to where we were pre covid . A comparison chart will be made on what each school is doing so the kids get a similar experience across the district.

Audience to the public: Parent of non profit speaks out – he founded a 501C3 organization that hosts afternoon sports and clinics that promotes inclusivity; Asking the district to reallocate the resources and space to the organization so they do not have to use public outdoor spaces and continue through the fall and winter like other organizations do. He spoke to the custodian and the custodian said the gyms have been empty. HS student asks about the pre-k program that they plan on running out of the Woodbury School and if they can offer an internship program or volunteer opportunity to the HS students there

Response to Audience of Public: HS student: Dr Rogers thinks it's a great idea and will connect him with someone who can help. He discussed current HS child development programs where students get to work with preschool students. Parent of non profit: moving to a new insurance company has raised a new level of expectations and it has been a challenge for those using the facilities and has also delayed the ability of approvals. He thinks next season will be more straightforward.



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Mascot selection process: A board member is asking if there is any chance to keep the name Brave in some capacity and give us some more time to see where things go in regards to the lawsuits. Dr Rogers responds that there are 2 lawsuits out there filed by 3 school districts that have challenged the state's authority to require schools to retire Native American themed mascots. Regulation is still enforced and the law is currently in place. The board has decided to retire the mascot because of these laws. The board can delay the process and wait to see how the lawsuits play out although we do have until June 2025 to remove signage with the old name and logo. People are confused about the word "Brave". They understand the image needs to be changed but are hoping we can hold onto the word "Brave". An advisory committee will be formed to help further the discussions regarding the mascot.

Food service contract: the topic being discussed is the contract for the consultant to review our bid for outsourced lunch – the board member raised the question, can we have a strategic level conversation about outsourcing our lunch on the topic of health and wellness for our children? He wants to know what are the other alternatives available to us? Trustee wants a discussion and presentation about what is available in other districts as alternatives. We don't want to put out a bid to a "for profit" company without this discussion happening.

The BOE is having a special meeting on 10/18 at 8pm and the regularly scheduled BOE meeting is scheduled for 11/06.

D. We heard the report of the **BoxTops** given by Carly Orlansky.
