Before we move on to any new business, we would like to thank last year's Fifth Grade Committee. It's a committee that takes a lot of time and effort and they did an amazing job bringing back some events we had not seen since before the pandemic. Thank you for giving last year's 5th graders an incredible send-off. We'd also like to give thanks to our outgoing President, Melissa Forman. We are grateful for her service and fortunate to have her at Whitman another year, still serving hard for our students and to make for fabulous events. And last but most of all, we need to give a tremendous thank you to Mr Snyder and the Walt Whitman staff. It always takes extraordinary effort getting ready for a new school year. It has valuable links to sign up for in-school events, join committees, important dates and reminders, everything you will want to know. If you have not already, sign up for the PTA Remind App, in addition to Mr Snyder's. Instructions are on our PTA website.

Over the summer, the PTA purchased some new playground structures and recess items. This includes 2 Gym-I-Nees which are wacky basketball hoops that multiple kids can play on together. We also purchased some new balls, jump ropes, and the like - to add on to what the school has so our students will have more than enough. We also had a big shed delivered to the school. It's not set up yet but once it is, the PTA will be able to store all our good stuff in it.

Class Parent applications are live and available on our website and via the link in the newsletter. The deadline to apply is Monday, September 18th. There will be a maximum of three Class Parents selected per class.

During the year as issues may arise, you will find many can be resolved following the chain of command procedures which can be found in the District calendar. - VI. Special Guests Board of Education and Administration welcoming visit. Dr. Rogers, Lisa Coscia, and Carol Cheng.
  - Welcome back to a new school year. Encourage parents to use the school calendar for following the new 6 day schedule as well as other important communication information such as contacts for the facilities flow.
  - Please attend and participate in our monthly board meetings. In order to get state \$ support for building improvements/projects, certain steps need to be followed such as completing an enrollment study and building surveys. At the next board meeting (Sept 11th, 8:00pm) the board will be discussing which projects will be prioritized across the district. Enrollment needs to be evaluated across the district especially when determining space at the middle schools and high school. For example there is space in SW used for offices that can be moved off campus to facilitate an increase in enrollment. Oftentimes class sizes balance out between grades (ie at HBT a large incoming class will be balanced out by a smaller graduating class resulting in a shifting of classrooms rather than the need for additional space). Before any construction can begin there needs to be a budget vote. Drawings need to be obtained (~ 6 months) and submitted to the state for approval. The turnaround time is currently about 42 weeks to obtain permits if the plans are approved. A public bid then needs to go out to engage contractors for the project. If the process were to start today, summer of 2025 is a realistic goal to start construction.
  - Recent changes made by the district's insurance carrier have resulted in re-evaluation of vendors
    permitted to be engaged by the PTA. The district uses a third party (NYCER). In an effort to lower
    premium costs, there are increased requirements for vendor information in order for them to be
    approved. We recognize this may be a burden on vendors and will work with recurring vendors to
    communicate the new requirements so they are up to code and can be approved.
  - The district uses the company Wisdom to provide a majority of the security guards. There are no armed guards on any campus.
- VII. Standing Committee Reports
  - A. We will hear the report of the <u>Arts in Education / Curriculum Enrichment</u> committee given by Jacqueline Braunstein

Our Arts in Ed programming for this year is being finalized!! Up first will be the Ultimate Human Board game, a life size board game based on character building, teamwork, sportsmanship and total participation. This program will be at Walt Whitman on sept (20 or 29th)(waiting for Snyder to confirm the date).

Fifth grade parents please save the date for the circus - week of Dec 11 with performance on Dec 15!

B. Now we will hear the report of the **Bookfair Committee** given by Jacqueline Braunstein, Cindy Ho, Rachel Levenson or Samantha Lebenhart.

The purpose of this committee is to raise funds for the PTA through the sale of books. It is also a great opportunity for parents to volunteer in the school! C. Now we will hear the report of the **Board of Education Reporter** given by Carly Laffie.

Superintendent's report:

- The elementary schools will be moving to a 6 day rotation because a lot of holidays fall on a Monday so this will prevent the loss of specials

- They will have better structured time for specials, interventions for students (therapies), school wide enrichment, ESL, they discussed more efficiency in staffing (as some are shared), social workers can do more intentional work with younger students

- Dr Rogers was following up on a previous issue that was relayed to the school district in regards to the truck development on Jericho Tpke and traffic concerns and what implications the Syosset school district would face. Dr. Rogers followed up with a letter to the TOB voicing our concerns as a district and we feel that they heard us since they turned down the approval of the truck development.

- High School day was shortened during COVID for a total of 9 minutes a day so there was better traffic flow between school dismissals - but are now returning to pre pandemic schedule. They are asking for patience as we go through the transition.

- Additionally. following up on a request that was made to the public portion of one of our board meetings last school year for Kosher, Halal and Vegan options for the students. They did implement this at the end of the school year; however, most students did not take advantage of the food options so they are going to meet with students/parents to come up with different options and potentially better food.

- This year we are rebidding our food proposal which comes up every few years. Might be exciting for some people here LOL.

- Following up on the First and Second grade classes for Mandarin classes since it met the State level to offer this. There was not a lot of interest to have a separate Mandarin speaking class for the 1st and 2nd grade students so they are not moving forward this year but they will be putting together a program to support students Heritage language so their needs will be met in a different way. Facilities update:

- Ventilation upgrades for pool facilities - just waiting on assembly. All materials are set and ready to go.

- Construction is almost all completed on the old tennis courts they were completely refurbished.
- The Southwoods library was refurbished and it looks great!
- Middle school gyms removed the motorized partitions and replaced with curtains for safety.

Following up on the facilities update from the last special meeting that was at the end of July

A board member suggested investigating the potential of splitting the high school into 2 schools

- Dr Rogers illustrated the benefits of having smaller schools
- Some Pros:
  - § Graduation rates increased in NYC when school size was smaller

§ More kids would be able participate in classroom and in sports teams

- Cons:
  - § Some electives might have to go away
  - § Difficult to have the same breadth of academic programing
  - § Smaller less competitive teams of athletics with less success
    - § More transportation costs
