

Our meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm with a quorum present. Attendance was taken by sign in sheet.

I. Board of Education - Central Administration - 7:30pm

Thank you to the Board of Education and Administration for joining us tonight. We sincerely appreciate your support in ensuring that Walt Whitman receives the attention it needs to serve our students & families effectively. Board President Carol Cheng and Trustees Jack Ostrick and Lisa Coscia, along with Dr. Rogers from Central Administration.

Carol Cheng - Welcome back, looking forward to a new school year.

Lisa Coscia - Welcome back, we had a busy summer. Please attend the September meeting. Meetings are once a month and you can attend in person or watch our live-stream. The agenda can be found on the Syosset website before each meeting. As an FYI, the school calendars mailed home contain a lot of useful information regarding policies on contact information.

Jack Ostrick - The district facilities proposition will be on the ballot for the October 1st budget vote. We have been meeting for over a year to address expanding enrollment. The proposition includes a 2 part bond. Part one: \$110 million Part two: \$33 million. The is a district wide vote and impacts all of the schools as they all benefit. The highlights of the proposition that impact WW are as follows: Part one includes the removal of the portables, security enhancements and air conditioning for the gym. Part two includes building a new gym and expanding the kitchen. Part one can pass on its own but part two cannot pass unless part one is adopted. The Board is here for you to answer any questions and provide information but cannot advocate for or against the proposition.

Dr. Rogers - Part one is based on recommendations submitted by an architects review of the schools which is required every 5 years. The district does get money back from the state for school enhancements. 10 years ago it was \$0.16/dollar and has now increased to \$0.38/dollar. The new gym will address the safety concerns during elections as the structure will be open to the public but closed to the rest of the school which is not the current situation. This will be a HS sized gym. The new structure will not affect parking.

To answer a parent question on what the security enhancements were as included in part one: Some of the security enhancements included in part one are confidential for safety reasons but do include addressing exposure to the cafeteria and enhancements to the vestibule at HBT.

To answer a parent question on what the district is doing to prevent weapons in the school, all security personnel are former law enforcement. There is a kiosk at the high school all students must pass through. Only a few entrances are open to let students in and are closely monitored by staff and security personnel. The district works closely with them and Nassau county to make sure property safety procedures are in place.
