IV. Principal's Report – Mr. Snyder

Hello and good evening. We have been enjoying spirit week here at Walt Whitman. The staff has been wearing themed outfits, for example Plaid Day and Favorite Holiday Day. We have also been actively adding to our kindness chain. The student council is responsible for adding slips of paper submitted when an act of kindness has been identified. One thing in particular that stood out were the 5th graders working together to create a presentation for a classmate who missed a bit of school. Winter NWEAs will be administered through the month.

On January 21, 2025 Dr. Wojcik will reach out regarding a Computer Based Testing (CBT) simulation to ensure students' chromebooks are in good condition and especially with a working stylus. There will be a fee replacing a stylus. Parents will be notified by the librarian if there are any repairs to be addressed. The simulation will not be graded. Today's presentation will be a summary on the district's Acceptable Use Policy. All district policies are on the website. Many students bring cell phones or iWatch's. All devices should stay in backpacks. If a student is using a device and it is causing a disruption to the educational process, the device will be taken away and will need to be picked up by the end of the day. Some highlights of the policy are as follows:

- If an event takes place over the weekend but is brought into the school on these devices, it becomes my responsibility and will be addressed.
- Anyone in the building using technology, whether using personal devices or district property, whether using district internet or not, falls under this policy. Devices can be confiscated.



Social media usage is covered over a 6 week program during library/media classes. Discussions on cybersecurity, cell phones, iWatches and social media are included. The program is mainly geared towards 3/4/5th graders but may shift to the lower grades.

Vote: Changes to Membership Dues

We need to address the increase in National PTA dues and plan accordingly for the 2025-26 year. Here's what we are proposing:

- Elimination of Discounted "Family" Memberships: Instead of offering discounted family
 memberships, we will provide the option to purchase two full-price memberships at once for
 convenience. This change will help offset the National PTA dues increase.
- Future Adjustments if NYS PTA Increases Dues:

If NYS PTA raises their dues, we propose increasing our dues as follows:

- \$18 per individual membership
- \$12 per teacher/staff membership
- A double family membership option at a reduced total of \$35



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These adjustments aim to ensure we can meet financial obligations while maintaining accessibility for all members. Motion was made and seconded. Motion passed.
