IV. Principal's Report – Mr. Snyder

The Fall Festival was a huge success. The kids and teachers had a great time making pumpkins for the Fall Festival. If you have not had an opportunity to read the newsletter, please do.

One topic that needs to be discussed are Class Parties that previously included snacks. Several students in the building have allergies and food sensitivities. We want them to still have fun. In the past, we required parents to use the District's pre-approved safe snack list per the District's Allergy Committee. Please work closely with your teacher and create a menu of what you will stick to from the District's pre-approved safe snack list. No exceptions. This is for the safety of all the students. This menu should be shared with the teacher and the building for approval in advance of all Class Parties for all classes to allow for review, even if the original Class Dues forms collected indicated no allergies. No changes after approval. The safety of all students is of the utmost importance. This applies to Class Party snacks, not what your child brings in for snack each day. This is not a peanut free school, however, if there is a peanut allergy in the class, then that student with a snack containing nuts will sit at a different table, which is wiped down after use.

*After the PTA meeting, on November 17th, there was an "Update to Food & Class Parties" for Walt Whitman Elementary. Moving forward, we will be shifting the focus of our parties away from food and toward fun, engaging crafts and activities that help students connect and celebrate together.

Other than that, I am looking forward to the best event WW does, Our Thanksgiving Feast. Mrs. Bloomfield, Mrs. Small, Mrs. Gordon, Mrs. Steinberg, and our Kindergarten teachers are planning a wonderful program for the Assisted Living Senior Citizens and students are very excited! We are going to try to incorporate as many students as possible. We did our Thanksgiving Craft today for our honored guests to take home.



A Class Parent asked guidance for scheduling Class Parties. Mr. Snyder replied that they should coordinate with their classroom teacher and decide on the three class parties' dates and time. Another parent asked about bus lateness and attendance - one bus is always late (after 9:05am) while school starts at 9:15am. Doors open for the buses at 9:05am. If you are on the bus, and it arrives late, your child(ren) will not be marked late (only if they arrived on the bus). Student drop-off in the mornings is still a problem. Some cars are lined up for drop-off and parents are still getting out of their cars, making others late, including staff who are helping children get into the building. Please share photos of vehicles that are creating unsafe conditions so that this can be addressed directly with those parents. If your child(ren) needs assistance getting out of your car at drop-off for any reason or has an instrument that requires your help, please park your car and safely walk your child to the door. Mr. Snyder will try to be present to address this ongoing issue. Unfortunately this happens at other schools as well. Regarding pickup - parents are required to enter changes to pickup in Pickup Patrol no later than 2:30pm. When parents arrive for early dismissal, they need to complete the student sign out form. Lack of parking at pickup is also an issue. Cars begin lining up at 2:30pm or earlier. Parents asked for a more efficient pickup process, however, over 33% of the students are being picked up, particularly on Fridays (and more before a holiday break). Unfortunately, the zipline feature is currently not an option as we cannot have cars backed up on Woodbury Road due to safety reasons. The safest and most efficient option would be to have your children take the bus.

V. President's Report - read by Cindy Ho & Danielle Sandjaby

This month we voted on resolutions, which were sent in an email blast. To save time, we took a block vote after reading each resolution/bylaw amendment and discussion, if any. Once all resolutions were read and discussed, we took a vote on all retentions first, then all the updates, rescissions, combined updates and recissions, and finally the new resolutions. Only paid PTA members were able to vote. The vote this evening will be taken to the NYS PTA convention which will be on November 14-16. The Legislation Chair, Bari Litvack, made a motion that was seconded to forego the reading of the resolutions as they were received via email. There being no objections, the motion to forgo the reading of the resolutions and amendments passed by acclamation. The Legislation Chair read that a retention is something that NYS PTA would like to keep as is. There is still a need for advocacy on a current issue, the resolution is relevant and should remain the same. All retentions were read and there were no questions or objections to supporting the retentions. The vote on retentions passed by acclamation. The Legislation Chair moved on to updates - an update is something that is still relevant but needs to be updated in a small way, for example words are changed or deleted from the resolution. All updates were read and there were no questions or objections to the updates. The vote on updates passed by acclamation. The Legislation Chair moved on to rescissions - a rescission is a resolution that is obsolete, for reasons described in the resolution's statement. All rescissions were read and there were no questions or objections to the rescissions. The vote on rescissions passed by acclamation. The Legislation Chair moved onto a combined update and rescission. This is a resolution that is being updated by combining two resolutions on the same topic for clarity. The new combined update and rescission was read and there were no questions or objections to the new combined update and rescission. The vote passed by acclamation. The Legislation Chair moved onto new resolutions. These are resolutions that will be brought to the floor of the convention for the first time to be voted on by the delegates in attendance for possible adoption. All new resolutions were read and there were no questions or objections to the new resolutions. The vote passed by acclamation. Finally, the Legislation Chair moved onto Bylaws Amendments for NYS PTA. There were no questions or objections to the Bylaws Amendments for NYS PTA. There being no objections, the motion for a vote of confidence for our voting delegates to vote on our behalf passed by acclamation.



The WW PTA membership voted on the Nominations Committee members in November. Our bylaws require three members from our Executive Board, two from our general membership, and one alternate. There were no discussions or objections. Thank you to everyone who submitted their names and to everyone who voted tonight. The Nominating Committee votes were calculated by the Recording Secretary, Sunita Hansraj, and verified by Theresa Seedorf. Congratulations to our new members of the Nominations Committee. Thank you for volunteering to be part of this very important committee responsible for selecting the future leadership of this PTA.
