L. Syosset Council of PTAs Committee reports

a. Communications Conference given by Timothy Deygoo - Communications Conference: Fall 2025 -

The conference covered a wide range of topics, including technology, teacher contracts, digital platforms, literacy and instructional methods, transportation, Guidance College/offers, and the district mascot. When meeting with fellow delegates, questions are first discussed as a group and then must be “approved” before being presented to the district. While this isn’t the most efficient process for getting clarity on outstanding issues, the district did openly answer questions beyond the pre-approved list. Below are the key items of interest: *Digital Platforms* - Infinite Campus is here to stay. There are currently no plans to consolidate TeacherReacher, ParentSquare, Pickup Patrol, or other tools into a single central app. *Educational App Restrictions* (Law 2-D Compliance) - The district blocks several educational apps due to their non-compliance with New York’s Law 2-D, which protects student data privacy. As a result, the district continues to seek “no-frills” alternatives that comply with 2-D while keeping student information secure. *Literacy & Leveled Reading* - All literacy programs undergo research and vetting before being implemented. In grades K–2, the instructional focus remains on phonics, fluency, and comprehension. Early listening skills are considered highly effective, and the district uses the Heggerty method—an oral and auditory program designed to build phonemic awareness (rhyming, isolating, blending, segmenting, etc.). The Elementary Literacy Council has piloted programs in UPK before expanding it to Kindergarten and 1st grade. *Electric Buses* - A transition to electric buses is not expected anytime soon. *Class Sizes & Teacher Contracts* - Class sizes are determined based on registrations, and teacher assignments will be communicated by the last Wednesday in August. Teacher contracts have not yet been finalized. When asked how parent input factors into contract decisions, Dr. Rodgers explained that principals—being closest to day-to-day needs—provide feedback that informs negotiations. The district negotiates with each unit lead on behalf of staff. A wave of recent late registrations has increased class sizes, and the district verifies addresses for those registrations. Regarding comparisons to NYC’s “20 students per class” mandate, the district noted that NYC has achieved this only by exempting many classes, making the mandate appear more effective than it is. Space limitations are another challenge in Syosset. While construction projects add some classrooms, they often replace others, resulting in a net-neutral effect. The district is exploring additional resources, including targeted extra-help opportunities prior to test days. *Mascot Transition* - The district’s attorneys are determining the legal deadline for retiring the current mascot. Although they are not required to make the change until 2027, the federal and state governments are still in dispute over certain aspects, so no official changes will occur yet. *Parents asked about ICT classes and the addition of them, especially in 5th next year. Mr. Snyder indicated that there are a variety of avenues and parents can advocate for their children to be evaluated if they feel it is needed. ICT classrooms are based on need. There are also some other variables and it does come up with parents when we are discussing the different options. By and large if a child as an IEP and child is required service it is provided through the consulting teaching model. Any kind of Whitman and Syosset centric questions please feel free to reach out to Tim. The next meeting will be in the spring.*
